We at Heart of America chapter are extremely happy and proud that one of our beloved professors from University of Central Missouri has been awarded ASSP's 2020 Outstanding Safety Educator. Not only UCM student section is part of the HOA chapter, many of the members of the HOA chapter have graduated from UCM (CMSU for those who associate with that old name).

Dr. Blunt has been integral part of the success of the Safety Program at UCM both in terms of growing the program and making it one of the mainstream majors that students could take up. UCM's safety program has been stronger than before under Dr. Blunt's leadership and has produced individuals that are passionate in safety all over the world. Dr. Blunt has worked hard in securing funding for the university to offer an online master's degree program and reduce hours for students to graduate based on work experience and certifications they have obtained prior to enrolling in the program. OSHA Interim Recording Keeping Guidance: In a May 19, 2020 Enforcement Memo, OSHA provided updated interim guidance to Compliance Safety and Health Officers (CSHOs) for enforcing the OHA Record Keeping requirements of 29 CFR Part 1904 with respect to recording cases of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).
