August Safety Spotlight: Member Interview

Derek Farmer, CSP

Director, Environmental Health Safety and Compliance, Wagner Logistics and
ASSP Heart of America Chapter Vice Present



Pride in our profession and the job that we do is something that we regularly hear from safety professionals. It is not boasting or pointing out how terrific we are, but simple gratitude in the people we work with, network with, and learn from. This is the same thing that I heard from Derek during our interview. Derek was humbling in the way that he talked about creating a culture in which employees want to come to work, feel safe at work, and recognized Wagner Logistics as a leader organization that cares about their workers and wants to brand a culture that encourages people to want to work at Wagner, employees that want to stay at Wagner, and those that want to grow and expand the safety culture not only within the company but to their homes, neighborhoods and community. These are strong convictions that Derek talks about which include mentoring, networking and valuing ethical principles for which the company can create a boundless culture of respect, inclusion and diversity around Health, Safety, and Respect for the Environment. Derek called this branding "The Wagner Way."

Derek has worked for Wagner Logistics for a year, this last July. In that time, he has become the leader of the "People and Culture Initiative" that focuses in on a team of seven employees finding ways to pivot the perception of the organizational culture towards finding and keeping talented, smart, positive-minded employees that embrace change and continuous improvement to build the culture of ownership, safety, and belonging throughout the distribution of 23 facilities located throughout the United States.

Current job duties also include wearing a "number of different hats" by maintaining worker health programs, managing worker safety programs, managing environmental permits, conducting hazard assessments, developing, and refining the company's process safety program and managing fleet operations for over 40 DOT drivers throughout the United States. As a Safety Professional with 18 years in the Safety, Health, and Environmental Industry (two of those as an intern for Alcoa in Denison, TX), Derek is well versed at what it takes to stay abreast of emerging hazards and technology, network with professionals across many different organizations and to mentor and encourage professionals and associates along the way. Derek considered the opportunity to impact the futures of many talented people as one of the primary reasons that he loves this profession and works closely with ASSP. Derek believes that a strong network of peers within ASSP, which started when he was a student member of ASSP back in 2003-2004, has helped him build his knowledge base, grow his support group, and stay current with regulatory requirements and standards through training, conference attendance and meeting professionals from across all industries. He attributes the exhibits at these conference events as an opportunity to learn about new products, find more ways to help his workers and to network with vendors and service providers.

Derek is an undergraduate of the EH&S Program at Southeastern Oklahoma State University in Durant, Oklahoma and has his MBA in Business from the University of Missouri – St. Louis. Kansas City means a lot to Derek. After completing his MBA, he moved back "home" to experience the great sporting teams and entertainment venues that the city and surround communities offer. Derek hobbies include spending time with his wife of 20 years, 18-year-old son who is a freshman in college, and his soon-to-be 15-year-old daughter that is entering into High School this year. Together, they spend time outdoors, at sporting events, hiking, visiting zoos, and seeking out festivals to explore.
