# Dennis Burks, CSP, PE

**MEMBER OF ASSP FOR 40 YEARS** 



Where did you go to school? I feel very fortunate to receive a college education, many of my classes were evenings/weekends: University of Central Missouri: Education Specialist and Master of Science: Industrial Safety

Pittsburg State University of Kansas: Bachelor of General Studies

How long have you been in the safety industry? It seems hard to believe, I have been in the safety industry for 42 years. It does not feel that long.

What is your current position and from a safety standpoint, what are your primary responsibilities? I retired from my full-time job at HNTB (Engineering, Architecture, Planning Company) in 2021, as the Corporate Safety Director, Associate Vice President. Duties involve the development, implementation and management of the safety & health program.

I currently teach part-time safety classes (I have been doing this several years) as an Adjunct Instructor, Great Plains OSHA Education Center and Adjunct Professor, Johnson County Community College.

What made you decide to go into safety? My first semester at Pittsburg State University I took an Industrial Safety class facilitated

by Mr. Donald Woolman. He was a very good instructor and I greatly related to the class, working prior as a construction laborer/welder. I later discovered; University of Central Missouri offered a safety degree.

What are some of your memorable experiences or accomplishments related to your time in the safety field? I have a lot of good work memories of seeing and contributing to various projects plus traveling to exciting locations (which has included Hawaii). I have been honored to be a conference speaker, receiving safety awards for my company, having safety articles published, being a safety committee member (i.e., ANSI ASC 14.3) and achieving various safety designations.

What are some of your hobbies or favorite activities? I enjoy being able to spend time with my young grandchildren and traveling with my wife of 40 years. I am an active member of the International Brotherhood of Magicians and the Society of American Magicians. I am also a member of the local Model A Club and own/work on a 1930 Model A Ford. ### Any advice for younger adults who are safety professionals?
