December Safety Spotlight: Member Interview

Where did you go to school? I received my undergraduate degree from Central Missouri State University (now known as University of Central Missouri) in 1981 with a double major - Graphic Arts Technology & Management, and Industrial Safety. In 1998, I received my MS in Occupational Safety Management. Obviously, I chose the safety route;-) which was one of the best decisions I have made.

How long have you been in the safety industry? Over 41 years.

What is your current position and from a safety standpoint, what are your primary responsibilities? I've been with Hays Companies (now Brown & Brown), an insurance brokerage firm as a Vice President of Risk Management Services since 2008. Most of my career I have worked as a risk control consultant in the insurance industry.

My primary responsibilities are to provide risk management consulting services to our clients helping them assess and reduce risks. My clients range in all types of industries from oil and gas, construction, manufacturing, agribusiness, chemical, food processing, wineries, retail, logistics, etc., which keeps life interesting.

What made you decide to go into safety? I started out as an Art major and took some electives in safety. Safety seemed to really resonate with

me and I eventually decided to get a second major in safety.

What are some of your memorable experiences or accomplishments related to your time in the safety field?

One of my memorable experiences was Dr. Bob Semonsick who was the Chair of the Safety Program at the time and helped me get my first job in safety. He later became my client when he left CMSU and went to work for United Telecom (Sprint) in the EHS department. I really enjoyed working with 'Dr. Bob' and appreciate all that he has done for the safety profession. I was also fortunate to have worked for Fred Manuele when I was with Marsh (M&M Protection Consultants) and learned a tremendous amount during that time. Later I was extremely fortunate to work with Dr. Georgi Popov who I have had the privilege of writing articles and books as well as developing standards. I have been very fortunate to have excellent mentors.

What are some of your hobbies or favorite activities? Fly tying and fly fishing for trout in the Colorado mountains; hiking and camping; working at our farm; family time.

Any advice for younger adults who are safety professionals?

Have a 'can do' attitude, be responsive and caring to others, be a life-long learner, get involved in ASSP and the OSH profession, and speak, write, and act with purpose.

What does your ASSP Membership do for you? It provides me multiple opportunities to enrich my life and advance the profession.
