## January Safety Spotlight: Member Interview



# **Bruce White CSP, ARM CFPS**

**MEMBER OF ASSP FOR 40 YEARS** 



Where did you go to school? Grew up in Moore, Oklahoma dodging tornados. Went to Oklahoma State with a BS in Fire Protection and Safety. Also have an AS in Fire Protection from OSU. Graduated in 1983. Joined the ASSP my Junior year at OSU.

How long have you been in the safety industry? Started in the insurance industry in January of 1984 in Oklahoma City Spent time in Houston, Nashville, Denver, and the last 29 years here in KC.

What is your current position and from a safety standpoint, what are your primary responsibilities? Joined Lockton Companies in 1996 so sneaking up on 27 years. I'm associate number 352 now we have 10,000 associates worldwide. Fun to watch and help grow a great organization. Prior to that spent 12 years with Continental Insurance and a short stint at Universal Underwriters.

I am a Loss Control Manager so most of my time is as a manager, I enjoy helping our safety professionals grow and develop into strong

consultants and trusted advisors to our clients. I also have a few clients that I'm their principal consultant. I enjoy having many long-term relationships and friendships with most of my clients. I focus a majority of my consulting in the fire protection and boiler and machinery areas but help our clients across all facets of their EHS needs while focusing on reducing their total cost of risk.

What made you decide to go into safety? I graduated high school was barely 17 and wanted to be a firefighter but wasn't old enough to apply, So I went to OSU to get a better background to help me be successful at becoming a firefighter. I enjoyed the fire protection and the safety courses and found out about the vast opportunities in the field, I also had a family background in Oil and Gas and even interned in a natural gas plant. I was interested in a career in the Oil and Gas area but my senior year at OSU the Oil and Gas industry collapsed and there were no jobs available. I was able to land a job with Continental Insurance company in OKC and 39 years later still enjoying a great career in insurance.

What are some of your memorable experiences or accomplishments related to your time in the safety field? I think the places I have been and the interesting people I have meet. In my career I have been in 47 states, (Alaska, Hawaii and Maine) 8 foreign countries and 1 US territory. Many great memories helping fellow safety professionals solve their safety issues that help us all save lives and protect property. I think my favorite was the ten days spent in Australia helping a client comply with Australian safety regulations as well as a healthy dose of sightseeing. When people ask me about my job I tell them it is the best job ever, it's like getting to go on field trips when you were in grade school every day. I get to help people, learn their business (abundant curiosity) and create great friendships and relationships.

What are some of your hobbies or favorite activities? Avid duck hunter, I go to Canada every year for duck and goose hunting, crazy fun. Love spending time with my 5 grandkids. Also involved in Scouting BSA, I'm on the board of directors and chair the risk management committee.

### Any advice for younger adults who are safety professionals?

Be abundantly curious, never stop learning, find a mentor and a trusted advisor.

<u>What does your ASSP Membership do for you?</u> ASSP has always been a connection to people who have a servant leader ethos. Great people to learn and grow with. I think membership also shows that you are invested in your profession and your career.
