As many of us are or have been affected by a heart condition, February is heart health month. If you have symptoms of a cardiac emergency, seek immediate medical help. It may seem so easy to say this, but in reality, many of us will not. We are too proud or doubtful to speak up. This week has been hard on our family as our plain salad every night and red wine almost every night father experienced just this. Being too proud, he did not speak up for hours until my mother, a retired physician, noticed his symptoms. One procedure later and he is back to life (days later). I cannot speak for all hospitals, but when you experience cardiac symptoms you generally do not wait in the ER waiting room. In sharing this with my young manager, it turns out she had just recovered from a similar event. The message is simple, if you have a heart, take care of it, and even if you do, you are not immune from a cardiac emergency. Stock, maintain, and keep your AED's less than three minutes away from your associates. If you have a large campus, you should have more AED's than a small hospital in some cases. Our campus has over 50 AEDs and when they are needed, they are priceless.






